

VideoCOSMOS presents a selection of video artworks and short films which were shown at the 11th Biennial of Young Artists of Europe and Mediterranean of Athens. Chosen by the Department for Youth Policies of the Municipality of Venice, represented by the portal www.shortinvenice.net, together with Bjoern Association, these nineteen works are intended to continue the journey of the 11th Biennial, giving the young artists a further place to express themselves – therefore it should be seen as a mark for a new direction

The same artworks were also shown at the 4th International Videofestival held in Mestre (October 22-25, 2003), as well as at the A+A Gallery (Slovenian pavilion of the 50th Venice Biennale), from November, 25th to December, 20th 2003).

This DVD has thus become a sort of a pocket-sized gallery, which can be staged at different levels.

It includes both the footsteps traced by the audiovisual experience in Athens and a sort of permanent exhibition. It is a flexible tool that invites us to frame the works in a kind of hypertext, building up an always different visual journey. These nineteen videos are the expression of an absolute experimentation. They talk about microcosms of imaginary through metaphors of style, video-documentation, narrative paths and animations. The artists' cultural and geographical topography stretches from Portugal to Greece, from the Balkans to Spain, from Algeria to Italy, from Malta to Turkey and France, but all of them lead to a unique Euro-Mediterranean cosmos.

Co-produced by the City of Venice and the Bjcem network, this work aims to demonstrate how both local and global could be the motive force of new Euro-Mediterranean imaginaries.


