

Persefoni Myrtsou's work proposes a subjective understanding of contemporary urban culture in total crisis and deterioration.

The photographic and video subject becomes a metaphorical and literal autobiographical means of contemporary society, trapped and traumatized by the supposed momentary familial happiness.

The artist stages her relationships, underlines the face's, the portrait's, humanism, a wounded mise-en-scene due to the lack of innocence in the portrait.

The face-subject is not, as Boltanski and Sherman would have it, a given of a social reality, but rather it is a figure that we need to re-capture, or, contrary, to abandon.

Capture or abandonment, neither can be achieved without returning to the procedure of the subject per se. That is, the return of a personal identity that in contrast to the collective one brings back the ego.





2005 Graduate Polytechnic Faculty of Thessaloniki, Department of Mechanical Engineering, Department «construction», Specialization «Construction Analysis & Synthesis», Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. Thesis «LOG Control in Active Suspension Digital Simulation and standardized by ISO pavements».

The project is the interaction of the user - viewer with a computer via a digital pencil and the design in real time on a huge area (via a projector). The design of the lines is governed by physical equations, depending on how to design the user specifies the depreciation, flexibility and the speed of the continuity of the lines. At the same time there is given an opportunity to the user to change the colours and the lines of the projection that he designs and to be able to create what he really wants. The work has been performed with the free open source programming language processing and licensed by GNV. Items related to work are:
